Medical Tasks

- 1.Check your health insurance coverage and the end date.
 - Understand the option to continue your health insurance through <u>COBRA</u> and Review the costs, coverage duration, and deadlines for enrolling in COBRA.
- 2. Fill necessary prescriptions before coverage ends
- 3.Compare Health Insurance alternatives:
 - Explore options like a partner's plan, marketplace plans, or short-term insurance.
- 4. Schedule Medical Appointments:
 - Book necessary check-ups physical, dental, and eye visits, and refill prescriptions before insurance ends.
- 5. Request Medical Records
- 6.Use remaining FSA funds and understand HSA portability.
- 7.Verify life insurance and disability benefits and explore conversion options if needed.
- 8. Notify Healthcare Providers of insurance changes and discuss payment options if necessary.
- 9. Ensure all beneficiary info is current for health, life, and retirement benefits.
- 10. Mental Health Check-In
 - Talk with friends, family, or even a grief counselor to navigate this transition. Losing one's professional identity through unemployment can destroy confidence which decreases interviews and job offers.



Financial Tasks

1. File for <u>Unemployment</u> Benefits ASAP

2. Review Debts:

1.Assess outstanding debts, determine which can be paused or scheduled differently, and prioritize payments.

3. Secure Tax Documents:

1.Collect W-2s, pay stubs, and any relevant tax information.

4. Determine Final Paycheck Date:

1.Confirm when and how you will receive your last paycheck.

5. Review/Rollover 401(k) Contributions:

1. Decide whether to leave funds, roll over, or cash out your 401(k).

6. Evaluate Current Income:

1. Understand any remaining income streams or side gigs.

2. Attempt these side gigs for extra income

7. Budget Minimum Monthly Expenses:

1.Calculate essential monthly expenses to manage cash flow. <u>Use these</u> <u>steps</u> and template from Your Financial Pharmacist team

8. Review Severance Package:

1.Severance is not legally demanded of employees unless the union or contracts state otherwise. Some companies will provide severance; review this <u>helpful article</u> for more insight.

9. Cut Unnecessary Expenses.

10. Consult a financial advisor to manage finances post-layoff.

11. Understand your rights

1. Mass layoffs require a 60-day notice via the <u>WARN act</u> (payouts are demanded if company is in violation)







Career Tasks

1. Curate a List of Non-Negotiables and Desires in your next job

2. Treat your job search like a job

1.Create a schedule, show up to work, create a list of activities below on your calendar

3. Grow your network

- 1.Job boards account for <20% of job hires, and networking accounts for >70% (job referrals, recruiters)
- 2. Build relationships with others on LinkedIn, Associations, Alumni groups, etc.

4. Update Your Resume

- 1. Revise your resume to reflect your most recent experience and skills.
- 2. Ideally gather metric data regarding your work outcomes (patient satisfaction or safety data, STAR rating, etc.)

5. Optimize Your LinkedIn Profile

6. Create a Layoff Post on LinkedIn:

1.Craft a professional post to announce your layoff and signal you are open to new opportunities.

- 7. Gather Contact Information of Former Colleagues for networking purposes
- 8. Back up any contact or personal information from your previous employer
- 9. Request LinkedIn Recommendations
- 10. Book Informational Chats with Mentors
- **11. Brainstorm Companies for Job Options**
 - 1. Identify 3-5 companies where you'd like to work and research them.

12. Create a Networking Tracker

13. Create a Job Application/Interview Tracker

1.Organize your job applications to keep track where you've applied.
